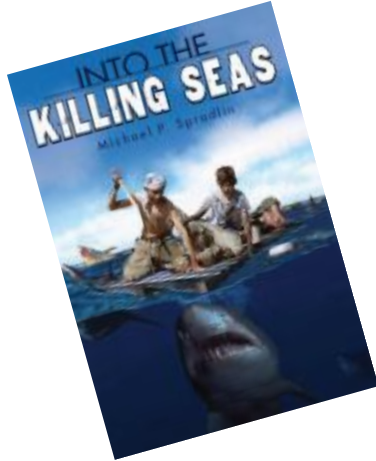


Michael P. Spradlin

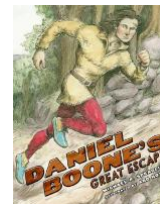

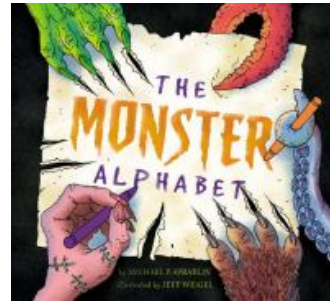
